2012 Overview


The Brockville Police Service answered 11,798 calls for service in 2012. The majority of these calls are handled by our front line patrol officers who are divided amongst 4 platoons. They are responsible for ensuring the safety of our community members on a 24/7 basis. In order to ensure our officers are on the road and in the community we have civilian members who transcribe dictated reports by the officers and enter them on our records management system. Each patrol vehicle is equipped with a cellular telephone offering officers the opportunity to dictate a report directly from a scene.

Our members continued their involvement in the community and were involved in a number of community events. Emergency Services Day at the farmers market, Remembrance Day, Canada Day, Law Day and the Rotary Park Revitalization Project are a few events of many. We are very proud of our continued partnerships with St. Lawrence College, The Brockville Rifles and the United Way. All of these groups working together to make Brockville better!
